



Guest Law Student Application

A law student earning a law degree at another law school who wishes to enroll in courses at Michigan State University College of Law for one or two semesters may do so as a "guest" or "visiting" law student. Guest law students are permitted to enroll in courses on a space-available basis after current MSU Law students have registered for the academic term. Michigan State University College of Law allows guest law students to enroll for fall, spring or summer terms. Prospective guest students may apply to the College of Law up to four weeks prior to the start of the academic term to which they are seeking admission. The following materials are required to apply for admission as a guest law student:

- a completed Guest Law Student application form;
- an application fee of \$60;
- a brief (one- or two- paragraph) statement describing the reason(s) for seeking admission as a guest student; and,
- a letter of authorization from the dean's office of the home law school.

Guest student applications will be approved upon the receipt and review of all required application materials. The Admissions Office requires an enrollment deposit of \$150 before a guest law student may register for classes. This deposit applies toward tuition charges, but is not refundable.
